We want to prepare our international students for college and enable them to meet their goals for the future. We also celebrate the experiences and cultures they bring to make us a globallyminded school.



With more than 80 years of history, Lancaster Mennonite is known to be one of the top private high schools in the region for our excellent college preparation programs. LM consistently performs above the national average for SAT scores, and its graduates have enrolled in prestigious universities such as University of Pennsylvania, Swarthmore, Juilliard, NYU, and Brynn Mawr College.

LM offers a rigorous college preparation program from grades 9 through 12, including an English as a second language course designed for international students. Students can choose from an extensive choice of courses, including Honors, Advanced Placement and Dual Enrollment courses for a more challenging curriculum and to earn college credits. With Advanced Placement and Dual Enrollment courses. LM students can complete a year of college while in high school.

Students have access to outstanding opportunities in visual arts, performing arts, athletics and clubs as part of the college preparation program, enabling them to benefit from a well-rounded educational experience.

COLLEGE PREPARATION

Lancaster Mennonite is noted for its excellent college preparation program. The Guidance Department is dedicated to helping students in the college selection process. To be accepted into a good college, students are encouraged to select a rigorous curriculum with Honors, Advanced Placement and Dual Enrollment courses.

Overall, the school offers 150 courses, including 24 Advanced Placement and Honors courses. With a low student-to-teacher ratio, LM's exceptional faculty is committed to providing quality education to help students discover their strengths and prepare well for college.





The Guidance Department administers several merit awards including the Global Citizenship Award and International Leadership Award to recognize students with strong academic performances, leadership and community service contributions.

ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE

For students whose first language is not English, there are different levels of English as a Second Language (ESL) classes that are offered to increase language proficiency and to help them meet college entrance requirements. LM maintains a low student-to-teacher ratio to ensure that adequate attention and effective coaching are available to individual students.

An English Proficiency Test Score is requested with each application. A TOEFL Score of 75 or higher is required to waive ESL courses.

ADVANCED MUSIC STUDIO PROGRAM

This program is for students who desire a special music focus in their curriculum and are interested in majoring in music at college. The students take advanced music courses during an extended school day. Successfully-completed courses through this program are added to the students' high school transcript and contribute toward graduation as well as college credit. LM graduates have enrolled in prestigious institutions such as Berklee College of Music, Manhattan School of Music and Oberlin Conservatory of Music after completing the Advanced Music Studio Program.











BLAZERS ATHLETICS

A full range of indoor and outdoor sports facilities supports its strong athletic program in the highly competitive Lancaster-Lebanon League. Offering 12 varsity sports, (soccer, basketball, volleyball, tennis, track and field, baseball and more) the school is well-known for its outstanding Blazer athletic program, having won several championships for various sports, notably the state soccer championship.

MINI COURSES

We realize that many significant lifelong skills and interests are developed outside the classroom setting. Mini courses are for grades 9-12 and provide opportunities for students to learn with their peers and teachers and benefit from teachers' expertise and creativity.

Mini-courses are a minimum of three days and may include overnight trips or day trips for those three days. Students may count school-led summer trips as their mini-course prior to their junior or senior years. Mini-courses focus on an academic area and/or service and occur every other year. Students receive a pass/fail grade for 0.25 credit.



DORMITORY LIVING

Our school has a dormitory, Millstream Hall, which offer a great opportunity for students to prepare for the increased independence and responsibility of college life, and to share their own unique background and experiences with others.

The dormitory has adults serving as resident advisors whose role is to provide support for each boarding student's welfare, academic progress and personal growth. A "dorm council" of residential students provides leadership opportunities to create a community that is caring and cohesive. A strong community is built through evening and weekend activities including shopping trips, movie nights, pizza parties, concerts, park picnics, local tours, college visits, community services, and much more.

Residential students have access to facilities on campus, such as the sports center and library. The dormitory is also within walking distance of several restaurants, shopping malls, banks, and hair salons.

HOMESTAY

Host families are available for students who prefer an enriching experience living with an American family and learning the culture. Host families are arranged through local agencies in the U.S. which match students with registered host families. Each qualified host family must pass a selective screening process, undergo a thorough background check, an interview and home visit from the local agencies to ensure they are suited to welcome international students into their family and home.



LOCATING A HOST FAMILY

Lancaster Mennonite School does not arrange for host families or homestays. School policy is that all host families of LM students must be arranged and supervised by an approved local agency. If students do not have an approved agency overseeing and providing support to their host family, they will be required to board in the school residence hall.

RESIDENCE HALL OR HOST FAMILY?

Being in a residence hall/dormitory with other international students can be a great experience. However, students who stay with host families become more immersed in the language and culture. Also, host families treat their students as family members – involving them in activities, excursions and household responsibilities.

CULTURAL IMMERSION

Homestays can provide a more authentic cultural experience. Depending on the level of involvement that you choose to have with your host family, a homestay can present an opportunity to experience daily life in the USA.

LANGUAGE SKILLS

Living in a dormitory, you may encounter a concentration of people who speak your language. But living with a host family will force you to use English with native speakers in many settings. Your adopted family can help you practice your language skills.

A HOME AWAY FROM HOME

With family and friends in a distant time zone, a homestay family can serve as your support system. If you allow yourself to develop relationships with your hosts, you can open yourself up to life-long friendships and connections abroad.

THE DISADVANTAGES OF A HOST FAMILY

If you opt to live in a homestay, you may feel isolated from other students. You could be further from the center of town and school activities, and you may not be able to visit friends easily without an automobile.

Key questions to ask yourself before choosing:

- 1. Do I want to live with other students like me?
- 2. Is learning the language and customs important to me?
- 3. Am I comfortable living in someone else's home?


AMTRAK TRAIN SERVICE

ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY TESTS

Students who are not from English-speaking countries are expected to submit scores from an English proficiency test (TOEFL, TOEFL Jr, SLATE or IELTS). Test scores help us to schedule students in appropriate ESL classes. If you are unable to sit for the test in time for the semester, please contact the school's Admissions office.

ADMISSIONS DEADLINE

Students are encouraged to apply no later than June 1 for the Fall semester and before November 1 for the Spring semester.

ADMISSIONS PROCESS

STEP 1: Complete our online application and attach the following:

- Copy of middle school and high school transcripts (with English translation and school seal)
- Two reference forms from principal and/or teachers
- Copy of student's passport
- English proficiency test results (TOEFL, TOEFL Jr, SLATE or IELTS)
- Copy of immunizations (translated)
- Financial documentation (bank statement showing parent/sponsor ability to cover tuition and living costs)

STEP 2: Pay \$300 application fee by credit card.

STEP 3: We will contact you to schedule an oncampus or Zoom video interview with an admissions counselor or principal.

STEP 4: If your application is approved, you will be sent an offer of enrollment. When you accept the offer and pay a tuition deposit, an enrollment packet and 1-20 form for your visa application will be emailed directly to a student or parent email address.

STEP 5: Submit the following before or when you arrive at LM:

- Health and Dental forms
- · Copy of new student visa
- Updated transcript from previous year
